GETTING INVOLVED or PUBLIC MEETINGS Project

United States Government-Fall 2015

Assignment:

- You are required to complete either the Getting Involved Project or attend a public meeting in Bryan or College Station. Attached are requirements for each option.
- You can attend more than one meeting for extra credit.

Due Dates:

- This project is for the 3rd six weeks, due **December 1**st.
- You may complete it in early for 10 bonus points (applied during the 3rd six weeks), due by October 1st. For 5 bonus points, you can turn it in the end of the 2nd six weeks on November 5th.
- Must be turned in by **December 1**st. Do not procrastinate on this because you need government credit to graduate and it is not possible to pass the six weeks with a zero for a major grade
- It is highly encouraged that you complete this project early!!!

Requirements:

- Reports must be turned in no later than 1 week after completing the getting involved activity or attending the public meeting (if meeting is Tuesday, your paper is due following Tuesday).
- Reports are to be typed, double spaced, and at least a page and a half 12 point font.
 Attach the meeting agenda to your report if you attend a public meeting. If you complete the getting involved project have the person you contacted sign a piece of paper with the amount of time you were there. You do not need to have anyone sign your agenda. Government teachers will have the sign in sheet faxed to us, so just sign in (city council)
- Your paper should have a MLA heading with your name, class period, and the date. Your heading cannot take up ½ a page.

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ATTEND ONE CITY COUNCIL OR ONE SCHOOL BOARD MEETING FOR A MINIMUM OF 90 MINUTES & WRITE A REPORT ON EACH THAT INCLUDES: 1) THE NAME AND DATE OF THE MEETING YOU ATTENDED; 2) A STATEMENT THAT YOU WERE IN PHYSICAL ATTENDANCE AT THE MEETING; 3) A DESCRIPTION OF THE ISSUES THAT WERE DISCUSSED; 4) THE POSITIONS OF THE MEETING'S PARTICIPANTS; AND 5) YOUR REFLECTIONS CONCERNING THE ISSUES AND POSITIONS OF PARTICIPATING CITIZENS. YOU MAY ATTEND MEETINGS OF THE OTHER BODIES FOR MAJOR EXTRA CREDIT.

OPTION TWO: GETTING INVOLVED

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WHAT is GETTING INVOLVED? Volunteering a minimum of two hours of your time working with a campaign, political party or an organization on a civil rights/liberties, environmental, peace, social justice, or other public policy issue.

WHAT'S THE OBJECTIVE? To participate in your own governance and to learn about candidates, campaigns, elections, and issues by becoming politically active!

WHEN DO I WORK? You are encouraged to begin immediately!

You must complete either the Getting Involved project or the Public Meeting project. You are encouraged to begin investigating the Getting Involved opportunities right away, since opportunities are limited!

HOW DO I BEGIN?

- Study the issues and qualifications, philosophies and positions of the candidates, parties and organizations by reading the newspaper or Internet web pages and/or by attending or viewing candidate forums and debates, speeches, or organizational meetings or events.
- 2) **Decide** which candidate, political party and/or organization best represent(s) your views and concerns.
- 3) **Contact** the appropriate candidate, campaign or organization to find out how and when you can participate.
- 4) Within two days of completing your political work, write a report that includes:
 - A. The **name** of the candidate or organization for whom you volunteered;
 - B. The date(s) that you were active;
 - C. The **name** of the person(s) whom you contacted and who directed your efforts;
 - D. The **reasons** why you chose your candidate(s) or issue;
 - E. A **detailed description** of the activities in which you participated (attach samples);
 - F. Your **reactions and feelings** about your political experience.

REMEMBER that you are required to complete a Getting Involved project or a Public Meeting project!
